- 1. Welcome, introductions and approval of agenda
- 2. Approval of the minutes of 3/4/21 MOTION: Move approval as written. Moved by Elizabeth Lasensky, Dawn Myers 2<sup>nd</sup>, passed unanimously.
- 3. Yolo County COVID Vaccine Rollout and Outreach to Unvaccinated Older Adults

  Dr. Aimee Sisson reports that as of Monday Yolo County has vaccinated 79% of people age 65 years and older. YHAA continues to receive reserve appointments each week for older adults, caregivers and health care providers of older adults. The YHAA phone number is listed on the county website as a resource and we continue to receive a few calls each day. As of today, all persons age 50 years and older are eligible for the vaccine in CA. Starting on April 15 all people 16 years and older will be eligible. This is all happening without a significant increase in the amount of doses available but this is

expected to increase in April. YHAA is able to connect people who are homebound to home-based

vaccine delivery via Yolo County. We are one of the few counties in CA doing this. The lowest vaccine uptake for older adults is in zip code 95605 in West Sacramento (Bryte/Broderick are). Yolo County is offering grants to non-profits for vaccine outreach and YHAA has applied to reach out to the older adults in this area and utilize Spanish and Russian speaking community outreach workers in the effort. We have many posters (thanks to Healthy Davis Together) speaking to the availability, safety and effectiveness of the vaccine with the 211 and YHAA phone numbers. The MyTurn app was piloted in Yolo County. It was effective for automatically uploading vaccine administration information but the appointment side was less effective. There is not a way to sort for Yolo County residents so 1/3 of 100 people in the pilot pod were not from Yolo Co. Yolo Co. is not yet able to utilize MyTurn for appointments for their clinics. They continue to use their website and Eventbrite appointments. Free transportation is available to vaccine appointments through Parntership Healthplan (if you are a member-almost all persons with MediCal have Partnership in Yolo Co.) or through Yolo Bus. Winters would like more outreach. Shortage of vaccine.

Call Davis or DC office- If on SSI and didn't complete taxes they will still get stimulus. 6-8 month wait time if amended tax. If SSI should not have to do anything.
